COMPLAINT

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This is deja vu. It seemed like the other day when I sued David Copperfield for using my godly powers for his magic tricks. It was case 05-446 JRT/FLN.

'(b) there is no known or recognized cause of action for usurpation of [Chris'] godly powers.'

David admitted he's got my powers, but the judge decreed there was no statute available (for godly powers) to seek a remedy.

'However, Plaintiff has failed to cite to an authorizing statute that would allow for such a claim to proceed.'

Well, I used the suit to obtain a patent. I now have a patent on godly powers - Pat#20070035812. http://www.objectforce.com/php/MyTrumanShow_/Legal/Patent/Patent.html. David has been infringing on that patent effective 29July2005 in accordance with U.S.C 35 § 271.

35 § 287 (b) (5) (A) For purposes of this subsection, notice of infringement means actual knowledge, or receipt by a person of a written notification, or a combination thereof, of information sufficient to persuade a reasonable person that it is likely that a product was made by a process patented in the United States.

USC 35 § 287 (b) (5) (D) For purposes of this subsection, a person who obtains a product made by a process patented in the United States in a quantity which is abnormally large in relation to the volume of business of such person or an efficient inventory level shall be rebuttably presumed to have actual knowledge that the product was made by such patented process.

David's product/trick/illusion is entirely godly - he rebuttably knew it was patented, and thus notified. He owes me royalties for the use of my godly powers effective 29July2005.

The scale resembles a curve similar to the current tax code, where you're taxed more if you make more. This is a fair system since magician's illusions/tricks and their salary are 100% a result of my godly powers. Notice, a magician making \$50,000 only has to pay 13.76%, \$200,000, just 23.96%. Very fair to the poor. Scale maxes out at 87% for cases like David who make an extraordinary amount. Minimum% is 30% for magicians who I have to take to court, but that's irrelevant for David - still 87%.

The calculation for the amount is as follows.

$(\$57,000,000/\text{yr}) * (.87) * (1.5 \text{ yrs}) = \$74,385,000$

Of course, I will adjust the amount when I get pay records from David's accountant.

I'm suing David Copperfield for patent infringement in accordance with U.S.C 35 § 271. I want past royalties totaling \$74,385,000.
